KEPCo Attends Southwest Power Pool Legislative Conference

Phil Wages, KEPCo, attended the three-day Southwest Power Pool Government Affairs Conference in Washington, D.C., where approximately 50 attendees were present, representing the utilities within the SPP region. A variety of topics were discussed, centered around issues impacting the electric utility industry and how Congress and the administration are addressing these matters. The speakers for the conference included several experts in the energy industry, as well as Members of Congress serving on jurisdictional energy committees and representing districts within the SPP region. These individuals included: Keynote speaker Congressman Joe Barton (TX), Chairman Emeritus and current Vice Chairman of the House Energy and Commerce Committee, Member of the Subcommittees on Energy, Environment, and Oversight and Investigations, and Member of the Congressional Cybersecurity Caucus; Congressman Robert Latta (OH), Member of the House Energy and Commerce Committee and its Energy and Environment Subcommittees, Congressional

KEPCo Conducts Annual Meeting

KEPCo celebrated its 43rd Annual Meeting November 15 in Wichita, KS. President Kevin Compton provided remarks and thanked the Board for their hard work and dedication throughout the year. Marcus Harris, KEPCo EVP & CEO, reviewed accomplishments made in 2017 and provided insight on the items KEPCo will focus on in 2018. The following day, the Board unanimously re-elected the current KEPCo Officers and Executive Committee.

Prairie Sky Solar Performance

Prairie Sky Solar, which became commercially viable in late February, performed exceptionally well this year, providing a positive net savings in energy and demand costs to the KEPCo members. Through October, Prairie Sky Solar generated 1,480 MWh and provided an average of 841 kW of capacity over the four summer peak months.

KEPCo Presents 2018 Budget

KEPCo staff presented the proposed 2018 budget to the KEPCo Finance and Audit Committee in November. The proposed budget will be presented to the KEPCo Board of Trustees at the December Board of Trustees meeting.

KEPCo Submits Grant Application

As part of the Volkswagen settlement with the EPA and California, a distribution of a set amount of money to each of the 50 states has been established. The amount, per state, is dependent upon the number of impacted vehicles in each state. Kansas will receive approximately \$15.6 million dollars over 10 years and the fund will be administered by the Kansas Department of Health and Environment (Trustee). As the Trustee, KDHE will have the responsibility of distributing the money on projects that promote the reduction of nitrogen oxide emissions, which can include the deployment of electric vehicle charging stations. KEPCo submitted a proposal to KDHE of a vehicle charging network that will place 38 charging stations within the service territories of KEPCo's member cooperatives.

KEPCo Attends Wolf Creek Tours

Phil Wages, KEPCo, along with representatives from Westar Energy and KCP&L, accompanied three separate groups on tours of the Wolf Creek Nuclear Generating Station over the summer and fall months. The first tour was with Paul Davis, candidate for the Kansas 2nd District Congressional seat, followed by a tour with the Joint Committee on Kansas Security, which is comprised of members of the Kansas Legislature, and the final tour was with the staff of Missouri and Kansas congressional members and state legislators.
